About Right to Work

Right to Work is a new and innovative service program, due to commence in early 2021, designed to support young people with an intellectual disability build employability skills and learn how to live their best lives.

We partner with local businesses to provide safe, supported work experience opportunities for our Program Learners that align with their individual strengths and interests, with all activities run in community spaces and local workplaces so as to achieve real social inclusion.

All Program Learners will have a customised program, informed by experts in allied health therapies, fitness, nutrition and the creative arts, designed to support continued skill development and independence.

About the Role

Learning Support Workers will be critical to success of the Program.

It will be the role of Learning Support Workers to ensure that each Program Learner has the space they need to practice new skills and be there to step in for one-on-one support when needed. Learning Support Workers will be trained to build continuous learning opportunities into every part of a Program Learner's day.

These positions report to the Right to Work Program Manager, and will commence on a casual basis with opportunities to transition to permanent full or part-time positions for the right people.

Permanent employment opportunities will be based on program demand, and we are also interested in establishing a register of people who may be available on short notice to cover sick and unplanned leave needs.

Pay rates will be in accordance with Social, Community, Home Care and Disability Services Industry Award, commensurate with experience relevant to the position.

Do you have what it takes to be a Right to Work Learning Support Worker?

We are looking for 6-8 people to go on a register for employment opportunities commencing in mid-January 2021. You must be able to commit to a minimum of two full consecutive days a week (9-5).

Each program group will have a maximum of six Program Learners, minimum three Learning Support Workers. The number of groups run will be based on demand.

Successful applicants will be required to attend a mandatory training program in January 2021. Dates will be negotiated with successful applicants.
